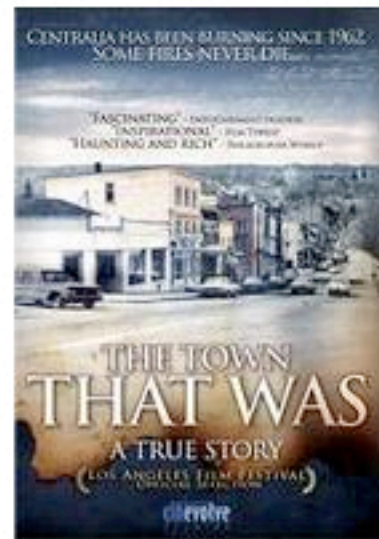

## Cinevolve Sets Two For May 19 Release



In 2002 the United States Post Office revoked the zip code of 17927, by their estimation the place no longer officially exists. How did the once thriving hamlet of Centralia, Pennsylvania lose its zip code along with all but seven (at last count) of its 3,000 residents?

A zombie plague? Nuclear fallout? A mad scientist's fiendish experiment run amok? All are certainly worthy explanations for a sci-fi thriller, but the documentary filmmaking team of Chris Perkel and Georgie Rowland's *The Town That Was* is every bit as compelling because their story of the death of Centralia is based on actual events — they spend four years filming the place.

Cinevolve Studios will release this compelling horror tale to the DVD arena on May 19.

Over the Memorial Day weekend of 1962, five members of the town's volunteer fire department had a "controlled burn" of the trash that they had collected from the local landfill. It was supposed to be routine, but it was anything but routine as the trash fire ignited a seam of anthracite coal that ran beneath the town. It ignited — hotter than the planet Mercury we are told — and it burned ... and burned ... and burned, and eventually undermined the highway, spewed toxic gas and drove all but a hardy handful from this once peaceful rural paradise. *The Town That Was* is all true ... and the story is as terrifying as any zombie thriller or fiendish experiment run amok!

Also streeting on the same May 19 date is the laugh-till-you-cry Brit comedy, *Sisterhood!*

Catherine (Isabelle Defaut) lives in London, is stylish and career-oriented — life is good. Little does she know, but literally half-a-world away events are unfolding that will bring chaos into her life.

That "chaos" arrives in the form of a New Zealand hairy-legged sheep rancher named Shirley (Emily Corcoran), who is on a mission. Her mother has just died in a freak accident, and the sheep ranch, which she thought was hers, actually belongs to a father she's never met. She must find him to set things straight!

Odd coincidence, but Catherine's mom has also just died in a freak home appliance accident ... and Catherine's never met her father either.

Quick recap! London, check. New Zealand, check. Sheep, check. Dead moms, check. Missing father ... this could be the key to it, especially since the film is titled *Sisterhood!*
